





## SEVENTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME [Year B] Sunday 25<sup>th</sup> July, 2021

First Reading: 2 Kings 4:42-44 They will eat and have some left over.

Responsorial Psalm: The hand of the Lord feeds us; he answers all our needs.

Second Reading: Ephesians 4:1-6 There is one body, one Lord, one faith, one baptism.

Gospel Acclamation: Alleluia, alleluia! A great prophet has appeared among us;

God has visited his people. Alleluia!

**Gospel:** John 6: 1-15 He distributed to those who were seated as much as they wanted.

## And a little boy will lead them all....(Isaiah 11)

When examining and reflecting on scripture it is interesting what comes to mind. When I read this passage from John, I immediately thought of that passage from Isaiah. There are many aspects of this gospel worth taking time over - the strong connection to the Eucharistic meal, the miracle itself of the multiplication of the loaves and fish, the 12 baskets left over, or even the hunger of the people.

However, one of the questions I invite you to ponder today is, "Why a small boy?" These gospel passages are not just a record of an event, rather they are carefully crafted stories with many hidden images and "signposts" within. Words and images are used for a reason, not just simply thrown together to create a story. So I invite you to spend some time contemplating this question – "Why a small boy?" On one level if we simply apply the approach of looking at the context within the text we become aware that children were, much like women, seen as having no importance in public life, at that time. Like many women in the gospels, the little boy is not given a name either. Being a male chosen however could indicate something of the potential that this little boy represents. The disciples may have gone against the norm by deliberately choosing someone who represented those on the margins, those who seemingly has little to offer.

On a spiritual level, what is this little boy saying to us? An invitation to believe that the little we have will be enough if we are willing to allow God's grace and Christ's presence to transform us? A call to trust in God's providence? Is there a simplicity within the little boys' approach that simply seeing people who were hungry he decided he would do whatever he could to help? Is it a reminder to us that we complicate things sometimes by over thinking them, rather than letting our spontaneous nature come to the fore?

As we contemplate these aspects, I wonder if that little boy is <u>each one of us!</u> How are out lives/actions mirrored in this little boy?

## Are we challenged by this gospel to:

Open our hearts to trust in a God that gives us the resources we need to share with others generously;

Be encouraged to listen to that quiet voice within ourselves that speaks of generous giving;

Be spontaneous in our loving?

Silence the voice that over complicates our kindness.
