THIRTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME [Year B]

Sunday 27th June, 2021

First Reading: Wisdom 1:13-15; 2:23-24. It was the devil's envy that brought death into the world.

Responsorial Psalm: I will praise you, Lord, for you have rescued me.

Second Reading: 2 Corinthians 8:7, 9, 13-15. Your abundance should supply their want.

Gospel Acclamation: Alleluia, alleluia! Our Saviour Jesus Christ has done away with death and brought us life through his gospel. Alleluia!

Gospel: Mark 5:21-43. Young girl, I say to you arise.

God's Limitless Grace

Interestingly during the week I was reading an article about a decision by the American Bishops at their Spring General Assembly. The decision has been made to "draft a formal statement on the meaning of the Eucharist in the life of the Church." Part of this statement is to look at preventing politicians from receiving communion if they support the right of women to have an abortion. Whilst I don't agree with abortion, it worries me a little as to what this approach achieves. Does this lead to thinking about denying others communion? *In some ways it is as if this approach seems to try to define or limit the receiving of God's grace, which works in its own mysterious and God sent way.*

Today's gospel reminds us of God's limitless Grace, through Christ. We hear two stories meshed together – a technique used often still today in storytelling, where instead of telling two stories, one "bookends" the narrative whilst another takes place within. The bookends of today's story from Mark tells of the synagogue official's daughter who is dying and he asks Jesus to come and save her. Before we get to the end of that story we hear of a woman who had been bleeding for many years who touches the cloak of Jesus and because of her faith is healed, and immediately Jesus feels power leave him. Then we return to the daughter who seems to have died, but Jesus invites her to stand and life is restored to her.

These are indeed Grace-Filled stories of the wonder of God's desire to be with us on our journey. More importantly they are examples of the **unbounded** Grace of God in the most difficult of situations. This poor woman who has been excluded from any community and place of prayer for the duration of her illness is suddenly restored to being fully accepted with all those around her. What an example of the presence of Christ changing the whole life of another. As in the Eucharist and the community, anything is possible because of the "real" presence of Christ and a single graced moment. ***Denied the presence of Christ would it be possible for the woman to renew her life?***

This beautiful story of the daughter of the synagogue official who to all accounts had died is transformed through the presence of Christ. This Grace-Filled moment shows us again the **unbounded** graces God imparts through Christ. The Grace of the gift of life itself. Without the presence of Christ the young girl would have remained in the place of death. For God's purpose alone she is now restored to the community that will love her and care for her. Surely these two stories reflect for us that the power that Jesus felt go out from him was simply the power of love or in other words – **God's Limitless Grace!**

When I reflect on these stories and the article in the paper, it makes me wonder why we would deny anyone the receiving of Jesus in the sacrament where such power for change and new life can be found. Who knows where God's Grace is at work at any moment! I remember a lovely old man, Frank telling me once that all his life when he has received communion he says in his heart, "Welcome friend". This was to give him hope after acknowledging, "Lord I am not worthy to receive you."

Let us rejoice in the presence of Christ and God's Limitless Grace! Alleluia! Alleluia!

Helpers at the door: As we move from trybooking to the use of the Queensland QR code which becomes mandatory everywhere from 9th July, we will still need some helpers at the door. Part of this change entails the onus being on the business to ensure that everyone uses the QR code. Should they not have a phone then the business is required to register them. This is a simple process using an Ipad which will be supplied by the parish for this purpose. This means we will need to continue to have helpers at the door to direct people to use the QR code and also to register those without phones. This is a much easier task than trybooking! If you currently are helping at the door, or you are able to volunteer to help, please call into the parish office, at a time convenient to you for a 5 minute update in using the Queensland QR code from a business point of view. Thanks for your help.

As from 9th July the Queensland QR App is **compulsory** in all places throughout Queensland. This includes places of worship. We will be introducing the use of this app from next weekend, **3rd/4th July.**

Firstly a HUGE thank you to all those who have assisted with the process of signing people in for Mass. It has been a big task and we thank you as a community for your commitment to this!!

This means:

- No more need to use trybooking;
- The use of parish numbers will no longer be valid;
- We can have capacity seating – you may sit wherever you wish;
- You will need to check in using the Queensland App on your phone or Ipad;
- Should you not have a phone, **we** MUST check you in. However it will be much quicker and easier for you to use your own device;
- If you have trouble downloading the app, please contact the parish office for assistance.

The following advice has been provided by the Queensland Government:

When using the new Check In Qld app to help keep you COVID safe the next time you visit St Patrick's Cathedral all you need to do is -

- ✓ Visit www.covid19.qld.gov.au/check-in-qld for links to download the app from Google Play or Apple App stores;
- ✓ Enter you details once when you first open the app;
- ✓ Open the app when you next visit us;
- ✓ Select “Check in Now” and scan or enter our code.

Using this digital check in means your details will be stored securely by the Queensland Government for 56 days to assist with COVID – 19 contact tracing (if needed)

The Check In Qld app is safe, secure and private. By using it, you are helping Queensland's Churches to stay open, and you can visit us with confidence, knowing you can be contacted quickly and easily if there is any risk of exposure to the virus.

Parking during Renovations to St Patrick's Presbytery

Fencing will be in place from Monday, 28th June

Renovations to the Cathedral presbytery will begin on the 19th July.

This will mean the area on the Neil Street side of the Cathedral will become the work site for Buckley Constructions and fencing will be erected.

There will be **NO** parking in this Neil Street area once the fencing is in place.

The driveway into the Cathedral will become **ONE WAY** – in Neil, out James.

The only exceptions will be the use of the disabled car parking, drop off and pick up **ONLY** entering Neil St and exiting onto James St via front of the Cathedral.

ALL PARKING is to occur in three available places:

- Behind the Cathedral (entrance Lawrence Street);
- TCSO carpark (Entrance Lawrence Street and walk through using the path beside the bell tower);
- Carpark located on the corner of Neil and Lawrence.

Street parking and pedestrian access via Neil Street is permitted.

The Neil Street Cathedral entrance will remain as the single entrance to the Cathedral.

These renovations will take between 6 and 8 months to complete.

These instructions apply to weekday and weekend Masses.
