THE MOST HOLY TRINITY [Year B] Sunday 30th May, 2021

First Reading: Deuteronomy 4:32-34,39-40. The Lord himself is God in heaven above and on earth below: there is no other. **Responsorial Psalm:** Happy are the people the Lord has chosen to be his own.

Second Reading: Romans 8:14-17. You have received the Spirit that makes you God's own children, and in that Spirit we call God: Father, our Father! Gospel Acclamation: Alleluia, alleluia! Glory to the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit: to God who is , who was, and who is to come. Alleluia!

Gospel: Matthew 28:16-20 Baptise them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.


