

The Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph

31 December 2023

First reading: Genesis 15:1-6 Your own son shall be your heir. **Responsorial Psalm:** The Lord remembers his covenant for ever. **Second Reading:** Hebrews 11:8 The Faith of Abraham, Sarah, and Isaac.

Gospel Acclamation: Alleluia alleluia! In the past God spoke to our fathers through the prophets: now he speaks to us through his Son Alleluia!

Gospel: Luke 2:22-40 The child grew to maturity, and he was filled with wisdom.

WHOLEY FAMILY

The longer I live, the more complex I realised families can be or become. Sometimes this is in the most disruptive or terrifying ways; but almost always it is revealing of deep threads of love which go further than we could have initially imagined. Perhaps this is not everyone's experience of family; but it is a part of my experience and an observation that I've made often over time.

Jesus did not appear in our midst as a grown person. He didn't even appear as an adolescent or young adult. He grew up like any of us. If the Bible has anything to say about His childhood and family life, it was that it was normal and unremarkable after His birth (except for perhaps His presentation and the time He got lost in the temple) –His life at home was quite normal.

There were even some texts developed in the early Christian centuries which presented Jesus as a kind of miracle child or the like. These were all dismissed and suppressed as untrue and misrepresentative of this God-man.

Without drawing out any stereotypes or pulling some sensational examples, I doubt the family of Jesus was all that different from any family of his time or ours. In gatherings of uncles, aunts, grandparents, cousins, second cousins, *etc.*, no doubt their interactions would have carried various joys and hopes as well as the normal mix of griefs and anxieties.

It was not naïve to these realities or with any kind of pious façade in mind that Pope Benedict XV

incorporated this feast of the Holy Family into our liturgical calendar just over a hundred years ago. So, I invite you to pray for your own families and any family you know to be struggling.

This blessing is offered by the Church for parents to pray with their family:

We bless your name, O Lord, for sending your own incarnate Son to become part of a family, so that, as he lived its life, he would experience its worries and its joys.

We ask you, Lord, to protect and watch over this family, so that in the strength of your grace its members may enjoy prosperity, possess the priceless gift of your peace, and, as the Church alive in the home, bear witness in this world to your glory. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.
