Some time ago I recall Father Hal telling a story about a young couple who had just been married. It was coming up to their first wedding anniversary and they were desperately trying to work out what they could give to each other, as they did not have much money to spare. The husband thought to himself remembering that he had his father's watch that had been handed down to him. The wrist band had broken some years ago, and although it meant a lot to him as it connected him to his father, he decided he would pawn the watch to buy something for his wife. His wife was in a similar dilemma. The wife had been blessed with beautiful locks of auburn hair that flowed down over her shoulders. She loved her hair for many people commented on its beauty, and was always admired by her husband. So on the eve of the wedding anniversary she snuck out during the night and sold her hair to be made into a wig, so she could pay for a present for her husband. The next morning, the morning of the anniversary they met to exchange presents. The wife wearing a scarf to cover up her lost hair tentatively placed her present in the hands of her husband, and the husband gently did the same. When they opened their presents, they burst into shared laughter! The husband had given his wife a jewel encrusted comb for her hair! And the wife, well her present was a new wrist band for his beloved watch!

It always challenges me to wonder whether I am willing to let go of something precious to me to be able to give something of value to someone else. Lent invites us to consider this in different ways. The three areas that we are invited to look deeply at during lent is GIVING, FASTING and PRAYING. Maybe some of us have always looked at these in narrow ways in the past, I challenge you to consider some creative and lateral thinking this lent.

GIVING:

Have we considered giving in terms of our time? Visiting people who are lonely or isolated. Have we considered giving of our energy? Helping our neighbor or volunteering for some organisation. Have we considered giving forgiveness or giving another a chance? Maybe we can give joyfulness and hope.

FASTING:

Instead of fasting from food or drink, maybe we could fast from the nasty word, gossip, self-centered behavior, avoidance of jobs or issues, bearing a grudge etc.

PRAYER:

Often we think of prayer as constructed and formal. Lent is a time to try a different way of connecting with the divine. Sometimes we don't think we have time in the busy-ness of our day. Maybe this lent we can find opportunities in the mundane parts of life. When we are waiting in a queue, we could be praying for all those refugees queueing for a new life, or those waiting for food. In the car we could pray for those travelling, those who have lost a loved one in an accident or be prompted by whatever store we happen to stop nearby, such as "Forty Winks", praying for those who have no bed who sleep on the streets. When gardening we could pray for the care of the earth, the seasons, the drought etc.

I'm sure you get the idea! May you have a blessed Lenten week of journeying with Christ. Have a great week, Father Michael
