THIRTY-FIRST SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME – Year B Saturday 03 November/Sunday 04 November 2018

- First Reading:** Deuteronomy 6:2-6 – *Hear Israel, you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart.*
- Responsorial Psalm:** I love you, Lord, my strength; I love you, Lord. [Psalm 17]
- Second Reading:** Hebrews 7:23-28 – *This one, because he remains for ever, has an eternal priesthood.*
- Gospel Acclamation:** Alleluia, alleluia! All who love me will keep my words, and my Father will love them, and we will come to them. Alleluia!
- Gospel:** Mark 12:28-34 – *This is the first commandment, and the second is similar to it.*

Loving God and Neighbor

This weeks gospel has a special place for me, as it was the gospel I chose to have at my first Mass, the morning after my ordination in 1999. It is one that has always resonated with me over the years. I guess for the simple reason that if we are able to get these parts of our life balanced, then surely all other things will be taken care of. Jesus, of course, surprised all those who were there listening by summarising the ten commandments in this simple statement. The first part of the commandments refer to our relationship with God and our holiness, and the second part concerns itself with how we relate to those around us. To love God and neighbor is a good shorthand version. This proved to all present what a good studious Jew Jesus was and that he knew the scripture by which they were using to try to trap him.

And so when I chose this gospel I was mindful of this. It may come as a surprise but I started my first homily with a joke! Inside my booklet was the picture that you can see at the bottom of the page. A few people were a little bewildered as to why a priest had a photo of two babies in his Mass booklet! However it was a story I read in Reader's Digest only a couple of weeks before. It told the story of Kyrie and Brielle Jackson born in 1995. They were born weighing only 2 pounds each (.9kg) While Kyrie was doing ok, putting on a bit on weight in the days following arrival, Brielle was not doing as well. Nothing they could do would settle Brielle. The nurse decided that she would try something different and placed Brielle in the same incubator as Kyrie. Almost immediately there was a change. Kyrie's arm stretched out, almost instinctively to embrace Brielle. Within a short time Brielle's heart rate stabilised and her temperature started to rise to normal.

For me this story is a great image of what community means. It is only when we reach out to others and give heart and warmth to another that we can truly see the depth of what it means to be in community. Our love of God - heart, mind and soul is the way we discover the joy to love our neighbour, as self. So, because we gather to pray we also gather to discover how we might reach out to others and give them heart. We don't gather as individuals but as a united community of love.

Let us celebrate those ways in which we have, as a community, opened our hearts to each other. The ways in which we have taken time with each other - valued each others paths of life – supported each other – spoken kindly and respectfully – and lived our faith that makes us neighbor to each other.
