OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST, KING OF THE UNIVERSE [Year A] Sunday 22ND November 2020

First Reading: Ezekiel 34:11-12, 15-17 – You, my flock, I judge between sheep and sheep. **Responsorial Psalm:** The Lord is my shepherd; there is nothing I shall want. [Psalm 22]

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 15:20-26, 28 – He will hand over the kingdom to God the Father, so that God may be all in all.

Gospel Acclamation: ALLELUIA! ALLELUIA! Blessings on him who comes in the name of the Lord! Blessings on the coming kingdom of our father David! ALLELUIA!

Gospel: Matthew 25:31-46 – He will take his seat on his throne of glory, and he will separate men from one another.

FEAST OF OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST, KING OF THE UNIVERSE

One of the more interesting singers that I have come across over the years is Tom Waits. Tom has an amazingly gravelly voice that takes quite a bit to get used to, but after a while you get drawn into his rather unique style. Tom is not a religious singer by any stretch of the imagination, but some of his songs are imbued with a message. He is also a great story telling using strangely relevant images and ideas.

In one of his songs, "Come On Up To The House" he describes the invitation to eternal life as God saying to us "come on up to the house." A simple invitation that is easy to understand and is as open as the front door to the house. Within this song is also some practical advice stemming from an amazing image. He sings about his challenge to Jesus, "Come on up to the house, come down from the cross, we can use the wood, come on up to the house." It speaks to me of there being nothing practical about Jesus remaining on the cross, but rather to embrace the resurrection and coming down from the cross allows that to happen. The joy of the resurrection - of new life, encompasses and surpasses the pain of any cross. So after Jesus comes down from the cross, as we are invited to do, then the cross, whatever it may be in our lives becomes of practical use. Just like the burning of wood can produce light and heat and energy, our crosses can transform the lives of others because of our experience of loss, pain and hurt. So today's gospel challenges us to "come down from our cross" and make use of what we know of life to bring hope to others.

How can we -

- Help the hungry and the thirsty;
- Welcome the stranger;
- Clothe the naked;
- Visit the sick;
- Seek out those in prison.

Can we remember or envisage those times in our life when we have been hungry for the love of another, the yearning for inclusion, the hope of being accepted by others; those times of being in a new place, a new job, an unfamiliar situation; those times we have felt naked not able to hide from others opinions of us, reminders of mistakes we've made, choices that have left us vulnerable and hurt; when we have suffered illness, when people have not known how difficult life is at times, difficulties of the mind that people cannot see, longing for understanding; when you are unable to travel, feeling the four walls closing in like a prison, living in a nursing home or place of isolation.

There are many crosses people bear, these are some. Our crosses can become our resurrection when we move to understand others who are or have, experienced something similar. These crosses become new life for others when we use our experiences to be of help to another person... "in so far as you do this to one another, you do this to me."

Tom Waits' song reminds us of how we share this journey together and our care of one another ultimately leads us to be in that house, invited by God to pass through the open door. In the last verse Tom Waits says:

"Come on up to the house, the world is not my home, I'm just a passing thru, come on up to the house." God Bless, Father Michael
